

Mrs. Zul: Well I wanted a boy and my husband P.C. Billy Boy Zul wanted a girl.



RICK WAKEMAN

interviewed by John Kercher in Rick Wakeman's absence

His raunchy, aggressive and energetic style has made him a worldwide superstar. The question is did he arrive intentionally or did he come against his will. There is no way of telling but maybe the following interview will throw some light on the subject.

Tell me Rick, how's it feel to know that you're a superstar, a walking legend in the world of rock?

"Great. Really great. I have a helluva job convincing myself that I'm just like any other normal, average guy who plays fourteen keyboards."

Yes, I was going to ask you about that. What with energy conservation and all that, do you see a future for electronics in rock music? Or are the chips down for a new technology.

"Quite frankly, with the development of the North Sea Oil Fields, I think that the real innovations are going to come with gas powered synthesisers. It'll only need someone to have a leak on stage, mind you, and some berk to light up a fag and the special effects would be great!"

Do you find that whilst a lot of today's pop stars attract a lot of groupies, your own brand of music doesn't attract them for the same reason?

"Yes, I think thats fair to say. I think my basic appeal lies in my organ!"

Which is why you've given up wearing the cape which epitomized the mystical processes inherent in your being at that time in your



career?

"That, and the fact I kept tripping over the bloody thing."

You were, of course, one of the first Western rock musicians to visit South America. It must have been an incredible experience this meeting of two cultures. So how did you like the coffee?

"Not bad at all."

"I'd say it's a case of which records haven't been scratched that I can listen to. I like Stravinsky and Bizet and 'Yes We Have No Bananas!"

Whilst we're on the subject, what colour and type underpants do you wear?

"2. J.B.L. 18 inch with 4.J.B.L. horns specially designed to low frequency to contain the Korgs".

It's taken two years to put this new album together. Why so long?

How did you find Switzerland?

When you were with 'Yes', is it true that you had half a dozen articulated trucks to carry the gear?


