Ashley Holt Vocals and electronic percussion

Lovingly referred to by the band as the Fat Man of Pop — lovingly referred to by his wife as an overweight slob.

Ashley and Rick have worked together now off and on for twenty four years.

Ashley quite seriously has one of the most highly rated voices in the industry . . . sadly it's the car industry, and not that of his fellow band members, who refer to him as "Breath of Trigger Gob" .

What can one say about Davy that he hasn't said himself. Well not much that is printable, but we'll do our best.

He's Scottish, invests heavily in new padlocks for his wallet, and is shortly emigrating to Australia . . . with his beloved wallet, still in as new condition, going with him.

Ashley and Tony are very keen on extracting some of the contents of this as yet unseen piece of folding leather before he departs these shores. Failure in this area will almost certainly result in Davy arriving in Australia in minute little pieces, which ironically is how Davy's wife refers to his naughty bits .

Tony Fernandez Drums & electronic percussion

The Greasy Dago, (he is of Italian extract), has worked with the ERE now for fifteen years, very much on a part time basis. By this we mean that he invariably parts time from the rest of the band during the performance. He refers to himself as "slick" meaning smooth and refined, but in the band we refer to him as "slick" meaning crude and oily. His drum solos are nothing short of spectacular . . . in fact they're well short of spectacular ! Being serious for a moment, he is quite simply Rick's first choice drummer . . . after all, who else would work for the money the ERE get!

equipment

Rick's keyboards are carefully midied together via a Sychologic computer system, enabling him to change sounds in fractions of a second in situations that are impossible to do so manually.

The system has been created by Stuart Sawney (who is also Rick's studio enginer) and Chris McLeod, who is a leading exponent in keyboard and computer rigs.

Rick has a multitude of equipment on stage including effects racks and rack mount "keyboards", but very special thanks must go to KORG, YAMAHA, ENSONIQ, ROLAND and CHEETAH, all of whom work very closely with Rick and without their help the show you will see tonight certainly could not have taken place.

Rick's sound system for personal monitoring on stage is from CELESTION, and Rick describes it as the ultimate in keyboard monitoring. The percussion area is looked after by Chris Ransom, or Props as he is affectionately known. His wide experience has seen him work with Carl Palmer, Ian Paice and Bill Bruford, to name just a few.

The rest of the band presume that for Props, working with the Greasy Wop must be equivalent to Princess Diana living in Peckham.

Nobody gives a toss about the bass equipment and that usually gets set up last by the stage doorman or passing traffic warden.

Out front the sound system is supplied by BHS Sound Services and the engineer in charge out front is "Stan" Stanfield. At the monitors on stage will either be Ian Barfoot or Simon "Botty" Ward.

At the merchandising desk in the foyer, you will either be served by Michael Goodman or Rick's son Adam. Either will undoubtedly short change you or sell you something you don't really want.

They have been well trained!



For those of you even remotely interested in the career of Rick and the lads, then there is a club which deals specifically with what's going on with Rick, The English Rock Ensemble, and also keeps members in the know regarding his exploits with Anderson Bruford Wakeman and Howe.

Every two months the RWCC sends out a comprehensive bulletin to members and it's office is on " office hours " call to answer queries.

If you would like to join this merry band of musical freaks then you are most welcome to do So.

There is a small fee of £5 per year, (£7. 50p elsewhere in Europe, and £10 for the rest of the world), which goes towards the cost of running the RWCC and the bulletins.



Rick's Top Ten outsides of his music and family

- Golf. (Handicap 17). Member of both

- 2 Cars. Has a great love of the four wheeler and has in his lifetime so far owned (and sold) over 250 cars, many of them very collectible such as vintage Rolls Royces, Bentleys, Jaguars, Lamborghinis, Masseratis and Jensens to name but a few. Currently drives a concours condition RR Camargue which was rebuilt for him by Nigel Mansell's garage in Bournemouth (Westover Motors). (Nigel is Rick's neighbour on the Isle of Man and they can often be seen together on the golf course).
- 3 Television. Rick is a TV fanatic, and has both SKY and BSB pumped through the eight televisions in his house! Rick is mainly a fan of comedy and has a video collection of comedy programmes and films that total over one thousand hours.
- 4 Football. Rick has supported Brentford football club since 1954 when his father first took him at the tender age of five. His association with them included a spell as a director.

- 5 Pets. The family have numerous family pets which at the last count seemed to add up to three horses, two dogs, six cats, seven goldfish and eighteen budgerigars!
- 6 Painting. Although he rarely finds the time due to pressure of work, Rick is an enthusiastic oil painter and his easel is permanently set up in his music room at his home.
- 7 Books. Rick has a collection of over 3000 books of all varieties. They range from science fiction and reference books dating back to the last century to a complete collection of the Richmal Crompton William books (which he still collects so if you have one for sale, hardback only, give Susie James a ring at his office!)
- 8 Cooking. If he was not in the music industry there is little doubt he would be in the restaurant business. He is never happier than when he is in the kitchen and for the past five or so years has been compiling his cookbook which one day he may even get round to completing.
- 9 Politics. Now that's surprised you, but it's true. One of Rick's ambitions is to do a University degree course in British Politics and this he hopes to do within the next five years.
- 10 Fountain Pens...Rick has quite a collection now, all adorning his desk, and all used in his own weird form of rotation and with his own ink mixture . . . don't worry, they'll come and take him away one day!

Rick Wakeman Potted Biography.

Born May 18th 1949 in Perivale, Middlesex.

Studied classical piano from the age of five, completing all eight Associated Board grades in both theory and practical.

On completion of his A-levels at Drayton Manor County Grammar school in West London he attended the Royal College of music for two years studying piano, clarinet, modern music and orchestration.

Performed on more than 2000 sessions, which include such notable performances as the Hunky Dory album with David Bowie as well as his legendary Space Oddity and the odds are that you've heard his piano playing on Cat Stevens' Morning has Broken more than a few times.

Joined Strawbs the end of March 1970 and left them to join YES August of the following year. He left YES on his birthday in 1974 only to rejoin them again in November 1976 in Switzerland, which he made his home for five years.

He left YES again in December 1979 and "sort of "rejoined yet again in 1988 when he got together with three of his old compatriots from YES to form Anderson, Bruford, Wakeman and Howe.

He has recorded 28 solo albums and has recorded on 10 different labels in the UK alone. They are A&M, Atlantic, Charisma, WEA, Moon, Arista, Virgin, President, Coda and Stylus.

The latest available tally shows sales of Rick's albums to be in excess of 50 million.

Since 1970 he has performed over one thousand concerts as a solo artist or with either Strawbs or Yes.

He has had numerous homes in numerous countries, but in 1987 moved to the Isle of Man and is now permanently settled on the Island he calls his paradise.

He still nurtures a few ambitions within the music business which include touring India and surrounding countries in Asia, and also behind the now crumbling Iron Curtain.

On a solo front, expect substantial recorded releases from Rick next year. Night Airs (the third and final set of piano solos) is due for release by President records as is a final, as yet, untitled 6th album in the New Age Collection for the same label. The music from the Great North 2000 festival in Newcastle, which Rick was commissioned to write, in is also now available direct from the festival itself. ABWH have an album ready for release in the early part of 1991 and a possible tour is on the cards. Ambient Records intend releasing Rock and Roll Prophet Plus as part of a Private Collection of unreleased material that Rick has accumillated over the years. This first release will consist of selected tracks from the Rock and Roll Prophet album which was originally released on the now defunct

length of recording to somewhere between fifty minutes and one hour.
Ambient Records also intend to release the music from the soundtrack of the silent movie version of "Phantom of the Opera", for which Rick wrote the music for features the English Rock Ensemble suitably enhanced with Chrissie Hammond and Ramon Remedios on vocals as well as D'zal Martin on guitar.

Finally, plans are extremely well advanced as regards a re-performance of the classic Journey to the Centre of the Earth as a full one hour spectacular with full orchestra and choir. It will take place as a one off in the UK, probably at the NEC in Birmingham, and will be televised, recorded and videoed.
